Religion 7/8: Our students have focused their attention on the following:
A: comparing the three Synoptic Gospels and the Gospel of John
B: Grades 6-8 will be teaching our PreK and Kd about what they are thankful for.

Religion Grade 6: We have just finished Unit 1 "We Answer God's Call" about God's promises to Abraham (*God invites us to respond to Him with total trust*), Jacob (*In response to God's faithfulness, we must be committed to our faith*), and Joseph, The Loyal Son (*We must love God above all else and remain focused on His will*).



Grade 5 Social Studies: Our 5th Grade will begin their first research project "Early North American Explorers". They will present their research in class (not sure of date yet), and then to the school as a Wax Museum display.

Grade 6 Social Studies: We are studying Ancient India at the moment and learning about their caste system, reincarnation, and Buddhism. The 6th Grade's first research project will be about Ancient Egypt.
